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21   The regular meeting of the Glendon Borough Council was held on July 21, 2022 at  
22   Glendon Borough Hall. President Donald Young called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.  
23   with the Pledge of Allegiance and roll call.

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28   **Treasurer's Report-**

29   **Bills to be paid:**

30   Councilperson A. Weisenberger-Caswell made a motion to pay two bills from the General  
31   Fund. Councilperson D. Breidinger seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

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33   Councilperson D. Breidinger made a motion to withdraw the motion made at the July 14,  
34   2022 meeting, approving the finished 2021 audit from the David Kunsman Corp.  
35   Councilperson A. Weisenberger-Caswell seconded and the motion was unanimously  
36   approved.

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38   Councilperson D. Breidinger made a motion to approve having the David Kunsman Corp.  
39   begin the 2021 audit. Councilperson A. Weisenberger-Caswell seconded and the motion  
40   was unanimously approved. President D. Young noted, per the proposal, that the price for  
41   the 2021 audit will be between \$2,250.00 and \$2,750.00 which will need to be reallocated  
42   in the budget when the bill is received.

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44   Councilperson D. Breidinger made a motion to accept the 2020 audit findings report from  
45   the David Kunsman Corp. Councilperson A Weisenberger-Caswell seconded and the  
46   motion was unanimously approved.

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6 **New Business -**

7 **Tree Removal between 22 & 24 Franklin St.-** A large tree between 22 Franklin St. and  
8 the parking lot at Borough Hall partially came down and is blocking half of Franklin St.  
9 Cones were placed in the road to alert traffic. Councilperson A. Weisenberger-Caswell  
10 made a motion to hire Burgey's Tree Service to cut the tree down, at a price not to exceed  
11 \$1,750.00. Councilperson D. Breidinger seconded and the motion was unanimously  
12 approved.

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16 **Announcements/Correspondence-**

17 Secretary B. Young stated that she found preliminary information online regarding  
18 PennDOT's Agility Program and it does, specifically, state that they will trade road striping  
19 for mowing grass. Council discussed potentially having the roads striped if Councilperson  
20 A. Weisenberger-Caswell would be agreeable to cutting weeds along state roads in  
21 Glendon, including Berger Rd. and Island Park Rd. as payback. She stated she would be  
22 open to that agreement. It was also noted that the agreement with PennDOT is a five-year  
23 contract that may be renewed in three-year increments, if so desired. Council voiced  
24 concern in paying back a one-day project over the course of five years and the inequity in  
25 payback value. Secretary B. Young will reach out to PennDOT to get more detail regarding  
26 the Agility Program and report to Council at the August 11, 2022 meeting.
