The regular meeting of the Glendon Borough Council was held on Thursday, February 13, 2025, at Glendon Borough Hall. President Pro-Tempore Amy Weisenberger Caswell called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and roll call. It was noted that due to the many absences, this would be an abbreviated meeting, and Council would reconvene the following Thursday, February 20, 2025, to address regular business.

Public Participation: Tony Napoli expressed an interest in the Old Stone Inn property. It was noted that there are a number of issues with the property that Solicitor Tom Elliott is in the process of getting sorted out. Robin Napoli inquired as to the total population of Glendon, and what exactly are the boundaries. Current population is approximately 365, and an area of about 0.6 square miles, bordered by South Side Easton at the foot of Main Street and Glendon Avenue, as well as Line Street at Holly Street. Williams Township also borders Glendon at Holly Street, Industrial Drive, Morvale Road, as well as Berger Road and Island Park Road at Mile Road.

Wayne Napoli inquired about the Old Bridge. It is scheduled to be removed by Northampton County, due to its current state of disrepair. Ms. Caswell noted that a foot bridge will be constructed due to infrastructure that currently runs under the old bridge.

Ms. Caswell asked for a motion to approve the minutes of January 9, 2025. Ms. Caswell noted that Solicitor Elliott had no additions or corrections. Councilmember Kathryn Harstine made the motion, Council Vice-President Mike Veres seconded, all Ayes.

33 technician who determined that they are not feasible. Mr. Veres asked about the pump in the
34 basement, but that is a replacement pump for Pump Station Four. Mr. Napoli noted that he is an
35 Electrician and inquired about the problem. Ms. Caswell gave him the information regarding the
36 incident, and he offered assistance for any further situations.

37 Again, Ms. Caswell asked for a motion to have the pump repaired. Mr. Veres made the
38 motion, Mrs. Harstine seconded, all Ayes.
